Decide today - a line must be drawn: On the one hand, the message of Jesus is that we are all one People of God , and that there is no division between 'Jew or Gentile, slave or free, male or female' (Galatians 3:28), yet on the other hand, a line must be drawn between right and wrong, truth and falsehood, life and death. Hence, the longer we delay in making a decision, the longer we remain in an impoverished state of being. Joshua in the first reading and Jesus in the Gospel ask the people to make a decision about which god they will follow. As long as they do not make the decision, they will never experience 'life'. Decide today - and remain committed: but the decision is only as good as the faith-filled commitment. When harsh storms attack us, it will be our

faithful commitment to our decisions that will ensure life is experienced. As Catholics, we can remain faithful to the Eucharist because of the life it promises. The promises can be summarized in the words of St.Thomas, "O Sacred Banquet, in which Christ is received, the memory of his Passion is recalled, the soul is filled with grace, and the pledge of future glory is given to us." Homework: reflect on the prayer of St.Thomas on the promises of the Eucharist. Also, reflect on 'commitment' in your life and in society.

Catechism Corner Series (from the CCC)

ARTICLE 3 III THE HOLY SPIRIT, INTERPRETER OF SCRIPTURE

IV. THE CANON OF SCRIPTURE

120 It was by the apostolic Tradition that the Church discerned which writings are to be included in the list of the sacred books. This complete list is called the canon of Scripture. It includes 46 books for the Old Testament (45 if we count Jeremiah and Lamentations as one) and 27 for the New.

The Old Testament: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, Joshua, Judges, Ruth, I and 2 Samuel, I and 2 Kings, I and 2 Chronicles, Ezra and Nehemiah, Tobit, Judith, Esther, I and 2 Maccabees, Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, the Song of Songs, the Wisdom of Solomon, Sirach (Ecclesiasticus), Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Baruch, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zachariah and Malachi.

The New Testament: the Gospels according to Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, the Acts of the Apostles, the Letters of St. Paul to the Romans, I and 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, I and 2 Thessalonians, I and 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon, the Letter to the Hebrews, the Letters of James, I and 2 Peter, I, 2 and 3 John, and Jude, and Revelation (the Apocalypse).

The Old Testament

121 The Old Testament is an indispensable part of Sacred Scripture. Its books are divinely inspired and retain a permanent value, for the Old Covenant has never been revoked.

122 Indeed, "the economy of the Old Testament was deliberately so oriented that it should prepare for and declare in prophecy the coming of Christ, redeemer of all men." "Even though they contain matters imperfect and provisional," the books of the Old Testament bear witness to the whole divine pedagogy of God's saving love: these writings "are a storehouse of sublime teaching on God and of sound wisdom on human life, as well as a wonderful treasury of prayers; in them, too, the mystery of our salvation is present in a hidden way."

123 Christians venerate the Old Testament as true Word of God. The Church has always vigorously opposed the idea of rejecting the Old Testament under the pretext that the New has rendered it void (Marcionism).
