# Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

<u>Discipleship:</u> a spirit of stretching. In today's Gospel, we confront the age-old question: Who is my neighbor? The Good Samaritan story tells us that the question can't be answered in a logical, legalistic, comfortable way. The Gospel demands a real stretch, and mercy propels us far beyond what appears expedient or even safe. "Neighbor" conjures up a comforting image. But the neighbor in need may not fit our norms or expectations. **Homework**: list a priest (safe person), a levite (safe person), and a Samaritan (person who stretches you), and pray for the three people.

Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Corporeal Work: bury the dead: Concrete exercise: visit the cemetary. Spiritual exercise: think about how God does not abandon me in death; reflect on those who have died in your life; meditate on Rm6:1-3 (Baptism into Christ is baptism into his death and resurrection).

Quote from Pope Benedict: it is un-Christian to rely on the failure of others. "The question that really concerns us, the question that really oppresses us, is why it is necessary for us in particular to practice the Christian Faith in its totality; why, when there are so many other ways that lead to heaven and salvation, it should be required of us to bear day after day the whole burden of ecclesial dogmas and of the ecclesial ethos. And so we come again to the question: What exactly is Christian reality? What is the specific element in Christianity that not merely justifies it, but makes it compulsorily necessary for us? When we raise the question about the foundation and meaning of our Christian existence, there slips in a certain false hankering for the apparently more comfortable life of other people who are also going to heaven. We are too much like the laborers of the first hour in the parable of the workers in the vineyard (Mt 20:1-16). Once they discovered that they could have earned their day's pay of one denarius in a much easier way, they could not understand why they had had to labor the whole day. But what a strange attitude it is to find the duties of our Christian life unrewarding just because the denarius of salvation can be gained without them! It would seem that we—like the workers of the first hour—want to be paid not only with our own salvation, but more particularly with others' lack of salvation. That is at once very human and profoundly un-Christian."

Rose Prince Pilgrimage, July 8-10: is happening outside Fraser Lake at the Lejac school site. Rose Prince, a student who later become a resident at the residential school, died at the age of 34 in 1949. Two years later in 1951 her body was found to be incorrupt. Beginning in 1990, there has been a gathering around her new burial site. The guest speaker this year is Deacon Rennie Nahanee, coordinator for the First Nations Office for the Archdiocese of Vancouver. Let us pray for all who attend the pilgrimage to experience the grace of healing and of wholeness.

# A Journey Through the Mass

# **Liturgy of the Eucharist**

The New Testament accounts of the Last Supper highlight certain basic actions of Jesus at the meal he shared with his apostles on the occasion of the Passover. The primitive Christian community "in memory" of him, continued these actions of Jesus and did so within a meal, at first a Jewish meal with its traditional prayers and rituals.

Factors were soon to exert great influence upon the structure of the Eucharistic celebration. Firstly, there were certain practical difficulties in serving a regular meal every week to an increasingly large number of people. Secondly, there is also evidence that certain divisive abuses at times occurred in conjunction with the common meal (see 1 Corinthians11:18). Thirdly, once Christianity began to spread into a Gentile milieu there was a danger that it could be confused with meals associated with pagan religions or certain political movements. As a consequence two major changes occurred, the eucharist gradually disengaged from the meal and a process of ritual simplification took place. The seven actions of Christ became four actions: bread and wine were taken, blessed, broken and shared.

# From the Catechism of the Catholic Church "I BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH" Paragraph 2. The Father

II. THE REVELATION OF GOD AS TRINITY

The Father revealed by the Son 239 By calling God "Father", the language of faith indicates two main things: that God is the first origin of everything and transcendent authority; and that he is at the same time goodness and loving care for all his children. God's parental tenderness can also be expressed by the image of motherhood, 62 which emphasizes God's immanence, the intimacy between Creator and creature. the language of faith thus draws on the human experience of parents, who are in a way the first representatives of God for man. But this experience also tells us that human parents are fallible and can disfigure the face of fatherhood and motherhood. We ought therefore to recall that God transcends the human distinction between the sexes. He is neither man nor woman: he is God. He also transcends human fatherhood and motherhood, although he is their origin and standard: 63 no one is father as God is Father.
