Mandatory Age Verification for Adult Pornographic Websites In Canada, there are no laws requiring mandatory age verification mechanisms for adult pornographic websites. Children and ado-

lescents often have unrestricted access to Internet- connected devices, and can easily be exposed to adult content on websites without restriction- whether intentionally or not. Studies show that early exposure to pornography can lead to distorted views of sexuality and its role in fostering healthy relationships. We see such an increase in addiction to pornography in our society and the resulting breakdown in families and relationships.

HOW DOES LEGALIZATION OF CANNIBIS AFFECT SCHOOLS?

- information from CISPG

Cannabis legalization took place in Canada on October 17, 2018. In BC, marijuana is still illegal for anyone under 19 to purchase, sell or consume, and remains a controlled substance, like alcohol. The legalization of cannabis will see very little change for our Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Prince George (CISPG). School Codes of Conduct and CISPG existing policies are already in place which prohibits intoxication, impairment, smoking, vaping, or drinking on school property for individuals of any age.

The <u>Cannabis Control and Licensing Act</u> creates serious criminal penalties for those who sell or provide cannabis to youth. The act also establishes new offences and strict penalties for those who use youth to commit a cannabis offence.
